
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Foundations of Government

Topic Summary

Around the world, people live under a variety of governments. Government exists primarily to provide leadership, maintain order, provide public services, provide national security, and provide economic security. There are three main systems of government: unitary, confederate, and federal. Finally, governments can be further classified by their economic systems—capitalism, socialism, or communism.


Summarizing the Purposes of Government



Have students prepare a Five-Tab Foldable as a way of summarizing the major purposes of government. The five tabs will be labeled as follows: *Providing Leadership, Maintaining Order, Providing Public Services, Providing National Security,* and *Providing Economic Security.* Under each of the "doors," students should record examples from the text of the ways in which government accomplishes each task.

Materials Needed: one sheet of 11" × 17" paper, scissors.

Evaluating the Main Systems of Government



∩ Layered Book

Students can evaluate the three main systems of government—unitary, confederation, and federal—by creating a Layered Book. Students should define each system of government, give examples of countries with that government, and evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of each type.

Materials Needed: two sheets of $8.5" \times 11"$ paper, stapler or glue.

C Folded Table

In order to better understand the four major economic systems, have students make a Folded Table.
